What is Contact Tracing?

Contact Tracing is a tool public health workers use to stop the spread of a disease. Here's how it works:

When someone tests positive for COVID-19, the health department is notified



Once we know who else might have been exposed, we contact those people



We call the person who tested positive for COVID-19 to see who else might

have been exposed

Public Health Workers will help them quarantine for:

14 days if around people that are high-risk for

the virus (**recommended**)

10 days if you have NO symptoms7 days if you have a negative COVID-

19 test on or after Day 5 and **have**

NO symptoms

If you get a call from your Local Health Department about COVID-19,

take it seriously.

What we ask for:

- Where you've been for the last few days
- The names and contact information of people you've had close contact with so we can call them
- We will NOT tell them who potentially exposed them

What we **DON'T** ask for:

- ★ Social Security number
- Banking information
- X Immigration status
